Introduction

2020 has been an amazing year for Infinity with Foundation original research, numerous game-changing discussions, and academic initiatives, despite unprecedented disruptions brought about by the Covid-19 global pandemic. Important people across disciplines were interviewed and participated in lively debates.

At the helm of Infinity Foundation, Rajiv Malhotra has successfully navigated the challenges in the representation of Indian knowledge and culture, and through his deep knowledge, profound insights and path-breaking books has established a very viable Swadeshi alternative to the western schools of thoughts which tend to have a biased and unsympathetic view of India and her cultural assets. By coining original vocabulary like crash of civilization, moronization, mutual respect, reversing the gaze, digestion, U-turn theory among others, Rajiv has brought to the forefront numerous challenges confronting Indian society both within and outside India.

In 2020, Infinity Foundation continued 26 years of path-breaking research based on Rajiv Malhotra's works on India's historical and future place in the world. We have successfully managed to challenge the existing negative global discourse on India. At the same time we have propagated and reinforced a very positive narrative about India, Hinduism and Dharma, based on


India's contribution to science, technology, mind sciences, architecture, mathematics, astronomy, linguistics, computer science and other fields.

One of the biggest game-changers we envisage for 2021 is the launch of Rajiv Malhotra's latest book "Artificial Intelligence and the Future of Power". This is a one of a kind book which highlights the current clash of humanity and cuttingedge technology, and tries to forecast what an Al-dominated future will look like for the world in general, and India in particular. The book argues that the current AI-driven revolution will have an unequal impact on different segments of After analyzing humanity. society's vulnerabilities to the impending tsunami, the book raises troubling questions that provoke immediate debate: is the world headed toward digital colonization by USA and China? Will depopulation become eventually unavoidable? The book is a wakeup call to action, compelling public intellectuals to be better informed and more engaged. Details are provided in a later section.

In this report, we will highlight some of the key discussions, debates and original research work conducted in 2020. The report will also discuss the launch of "Sanskrit Non-Translatables: Importance of Sanskritizing English" - a very important new book on nontranslatability of certain Sanskrit words.



Sanskrit Non-Translatables (SNT)



The last quarter of 2020 saw the launch of a path-breaking new book called "Sanskrit Non-Translatables: The Importance of Sanskritizing English" by Rajiv Malhotra and co-authored by Satyanarayana Dasa Babaji.


It expands on the original and innovative idea, introduced in the book "Being Different" that Sanskrit is difficult and at times impossible to translate into English because the underlying thought, expression, perception and experience is absent in western thought.

The book offers English speakers the knowledge to confidently introduce a list of 54 Sanskrit words (across subject areas) into their daily speech.

SNT Book Launch Event

The book launch event was attended by luminaries from different fields. Everyone shared their enthusiasm for the path breaking work that would allow us to present our core concepts in the way that they truly are and not water them down with translations that don't convey their true meaning.

Swami Govind Dev Giriji endorsed the book enthusiastically explaining that such books would solve the difficulties that gurus like him faced when trying to convey the meaning of Sanskrit words in English discourses on shastras. He said that this was an important first step to stand up against the cultural genocide of Hindus. Video



Dr. Subramanian Swamy talked about the book in the context of the cultural renaissance of India through the development of a modern Indian mindset





that is rooted in the past but ready to innovate for the future. Video




Dr. Vijay Bhatkar said that given his Vedanta training under a qualified guru, he was aware of the inadequacy of English translations in communicating the meaning of Sanskrit words. He welcomed the fact that it was an English book that was loyal to the tradition. He said that the book would help not only foreigners but also insiders to the tradition. Video



Mohan Bhagwat said that it was the misunderstanding of words that resulted in conflicts that Sants reincarnated to resolve. So the "gyan" and "vichar" behind the use of words are important. By reading words that the British mistranslated, we are misinterpreting our own history and heritage. The book can help us present ourselves correctly. Video

Dr. Kapil Kapoor highlights how the destruction of a culture can be perpetrated by the alteration of its language, because

the entire knowledge system of that culture is represented in its language.



So, since the Sanskrit language is the keeper of our cultural heritage, its misinterpretation or misrepresentation would lead to the destruction of our culture. Video

Madhu Kishwar explains how Rajiv Malhotra single-handedly took on the western academia that had pushed Sanskrit into the category of a "dead" language while continuing to digest its treasures. 


Covid-19 and the Aftermath

A significant number of discussions this year touched upon various aspects of Covid-19, its impact, and how we can be better equipped to deal with an uncertain yet exciting future.



Series on Ayurveda

He talks about how Maharishi refused to adopt a reductionist approach to Ayurveda and didn't believe in separating out active ingredients from the source plant when talking about medicines and pharmacology.

Rajiv Malhotra and Jay Glaser talk about the years of Deepak Chopra and Sri Sri Ravi Shankar at Maharishi Mahesh Yogi's ashram, and the influence it had on their subsequent careers. They then talk about how Dr Herb Benson studied Transcendental Meditation under Maharishi Mahesh Yogi and then went off to start his own technique modeled on TM.

Discussion with Vandana Shiva



Rajiv Malhotra interviews Dr. Mrittunjoy Guha Majumdar, a young Postdoctoral






Scholar who shares his extraordinarily courageous journey of battling Hinduphobia at Cambridge University, United Kingdom.

Discussion with Dr. Oscar Pujol






