



Rajiv Malhotra's Address to the Leaders of the Hindu Renaissance



As part of the grand 30th anniversary celebrations at Princeton, New Jersey, Rajiv Malhotra started his talk with his vision of creating a Satvik Standard Board to counter the dominance of halal-certified food in India and abroad. Through the Satvik Foundation in New Jersey, spun off from Akshay Patra's meal program, the goal is to serve free satvik meals in American schools and build a formal standard.

He linked his scientific background to Dharma, explaining causation in physics and computer algorithms, and extending it to karma as a transcendent form of causation beyond sensory limits.

Addressing academic biases and Hinduphobia, he described his strategy of reverse the gaze on adversaries through purva-paksha and countering them with reasoned arguments.

Rajiv highlighted the Infinity Foundation's 30 years of impact on gurus, government, intellectuals and youth by building frameworks and challenging academic narratives. He ended with tributes to allied groups, comparing them to a strong interconnected banyan tree, emphasizing efforts like creating a Dharma Index, formal curricula and training of Intellectual Kshatriyas. 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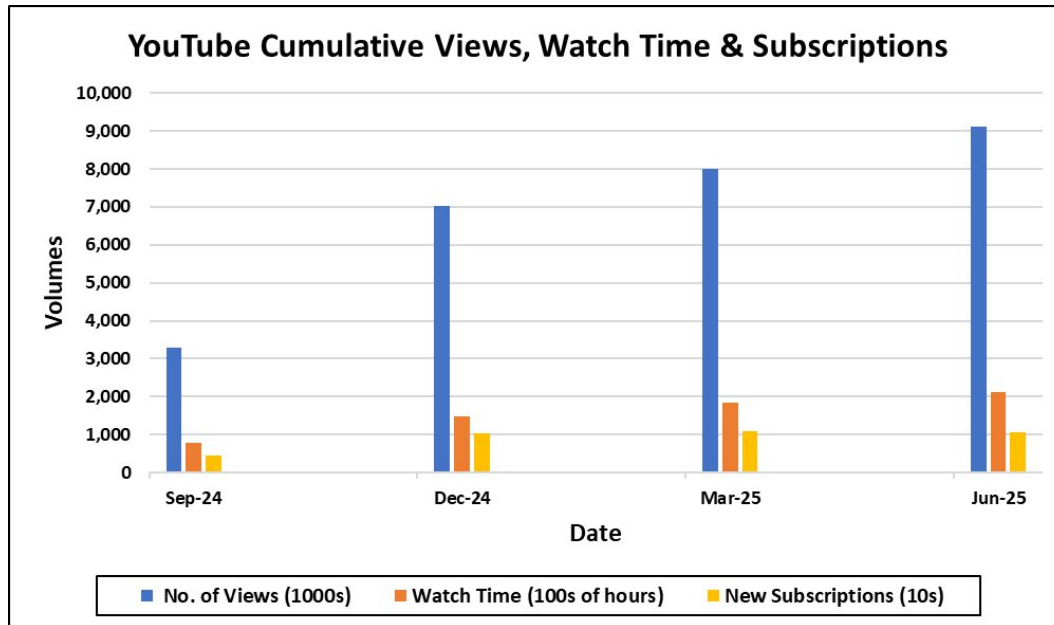
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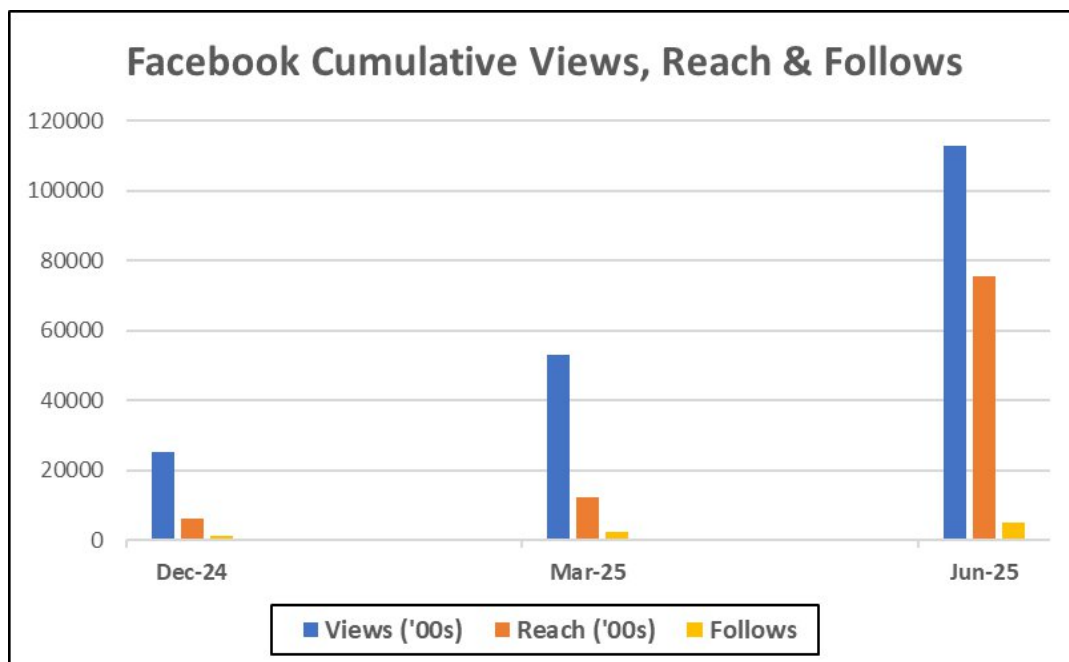

Our Performance

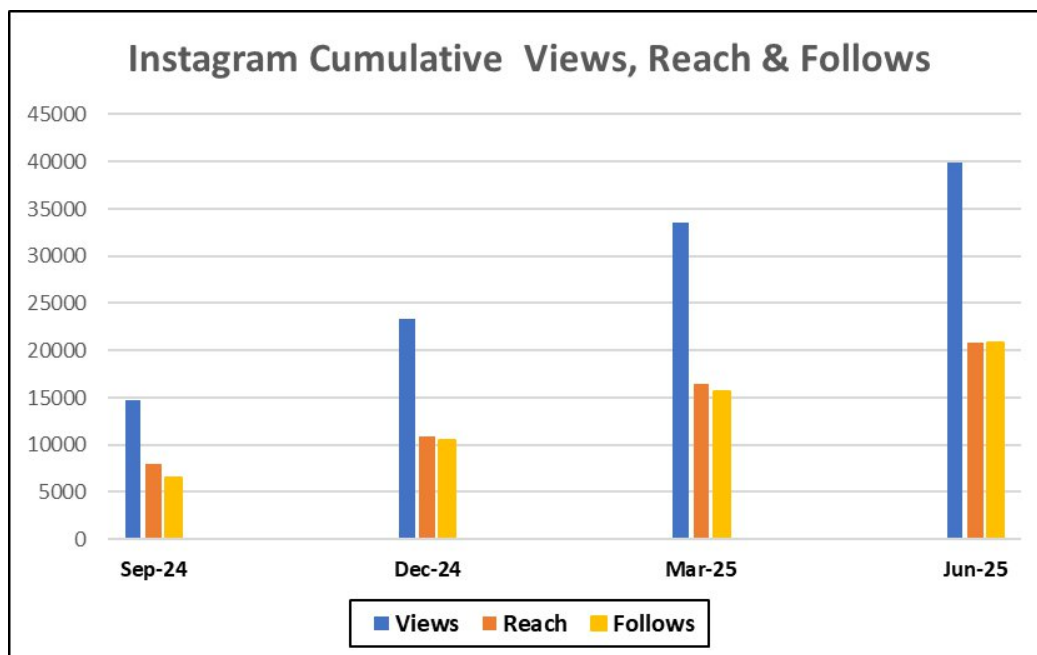

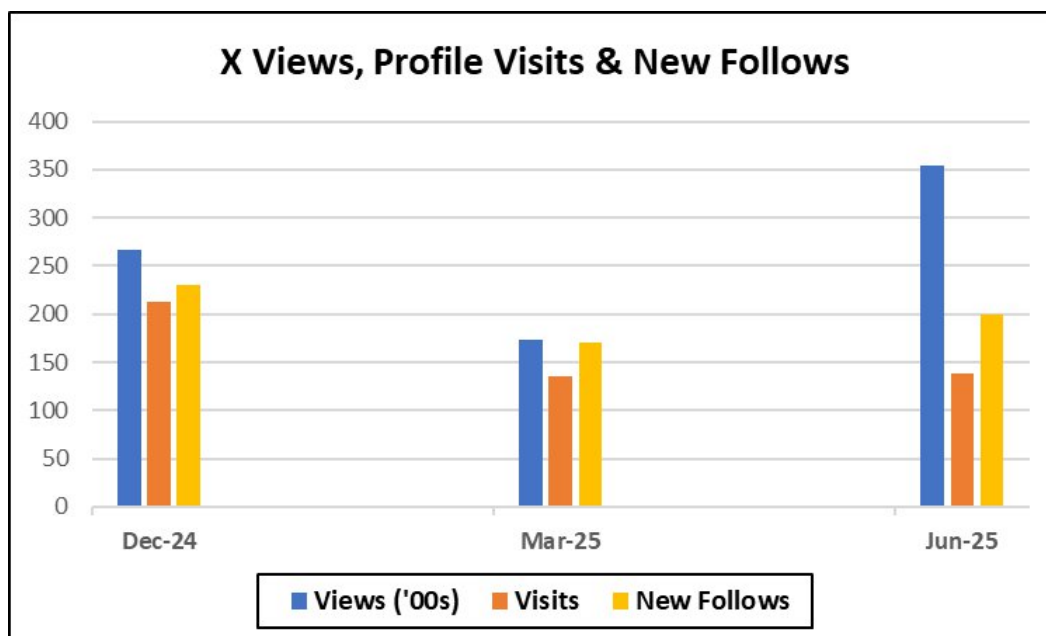

Who is Raising Your Children

The Neuroliberal Agenda Is Failing Our Children



Rajiv Malhotra and Vijaya Viswanathan, authors of the book *Who is Raising Your Children* discuss the neuroliberal agenda to manipulate the working of neurons in young children in order to brainwash them.

Through this brainwashing, they hope to achieve two agendas that are mutually interlinked.

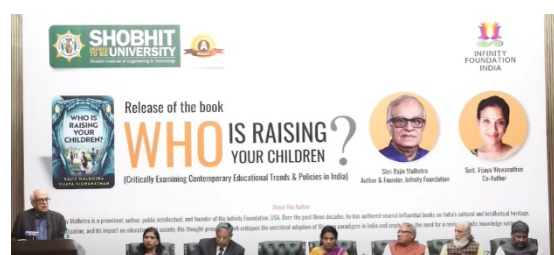
The first is the sexualization of children under five, sneaked in though the UN sustainable development goals (SDGs) and implemented as part of social emotional learning in school curriculums. This disturbs their mental makeup and identity even before they are properly formed, leaving them unable to connect with their family, people, country, culture and traditions, essentially spoiling their chances of building a family, and making them vulnerable to further manipulation against their own interests. The second is

global citizenship education (GCE) mandated by the UN.

The pandemic preparedness treaty of the WHO has draconian positions that allow the WHO to override the sovereignty of nations in case of such emergencies.

Many countries are rejecting these policies floated by the American left. But while America itself is walking away from them, India is playing along on all fronts, signing all these treaties that are obviously against the national interest, raising doubts about the Indian bureaucrats who appear to be working as foreign agents. Exposing WHO Agenda | Who Is Raising Your Children?

There is an ongoing narrative warfare that India needs to be a part of and so far, it has played a passive role. It has not only accepted UN SDGs without qualification, but has also signed the WHO treaty that transfers certain emergency powers to the organization.

China, Japan, Singapore have all objected to the broad directives of the UN's SDGs. China has modified them in accordance with its own laws. Pushback against the broad powers given to the WHO has come from 22 Attorney Generals in the US who have said that it violates the constitution.

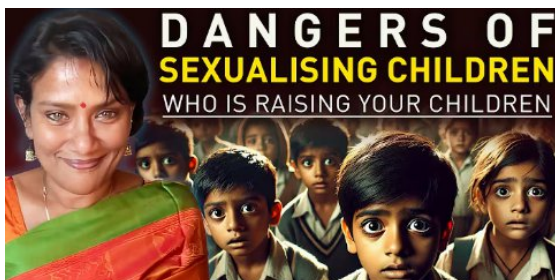
Japanese activists and scholars have also objected strongly.

The main reason that major world powers are objecting to these directives is that they are an infringement on the sovereign rights of nations. While globalism may sound good, the important question is the lens with which it is viewed. Competing with the American leftist version of globalism are the Chinese and the Islamic ones, each with the goal of spreading their ideas.

India's worldview is buried deep inside its ancient texts and do not find their way into social science text books or school curricula. So Indian children are totally vulnerable to global leftist influence in education, including on sexualization.

Dangers of Sexualising Children | Who Is Raising Your Children?



At Shobhit University, Vijaya Viswanathan highlighted the dangers of India adopting international standards, particularly those embedded within the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), without critical vetting. She warns that leftist organizations are using SDGs to push unorthodox interventions in Indian education under appealing labels like Global Citizenship Education (GCE),

Environmental Education, Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE), and Social Emotional Learning (SEL).

CSE, she explained, exposes children to sexual content and activities prematurely through WHO consultants, graphic materials, peer educators and apps. Indian institutions have adopted gender fluidity standards, that may in the future expose children to chemical castrations that risk sterility. Policies pushing for early sexual activity, abortion normalization, and raising girls' marriageable age threaten the institution of marriage.

She criticizes SEL for manipulating children's minds using behavioral science techniques. Despite its claims of promoting social and emotional skills, studies show that SEL does not deliver benefits and may increase depression and anxiety in students. SEL programs also involve constant, parental-consent-free surveillance, feeding data into control systems.

Viswanathan urged India to resist these disguised ideological agendas and protect children by aligning education with Indian cultural and moral values, rather than blindly adopting globalist frameworks. [Video](#).

The Rise of Woke Ideas in Indian Education: Should We Be Concerned?



In this powerful and unfiltered talk, Vijaya Viswanathan, co-author of *Who is Raising*

Your Children, uncovers the disturbing tactics used to indoctrinate children, shedding light on a reality many refuse to face.

From the normalization of autogynephilia to attempts to destigmatize or even decriminalize pedophilia, she examines how early indoctrination is reshaping values and social norms, often without parental awareness. The talk also addresses how concepts like gender performativity are shaping identity and behavior.

With a critical eye, she also looks at important Indian institutions, such as the NITI Aayog, which is playing a central role in bringing many of these poisonous ideas to our youth through funding and support. The NITI Aayog is leaning on the Tatas, HCL, the Piramals, as well as several anti-India American organizations to help it conform with UN SDGs, which constitute the umbrella under which all these dangerous concepts are being standardized. Artificial Intelligence & the Future of Power

Will AI Disrupt Democracies?



Rajiv Malhotra critiques democracy by highlighting that India traditionally was not a democracy but a society where individuals had responsibilities toward

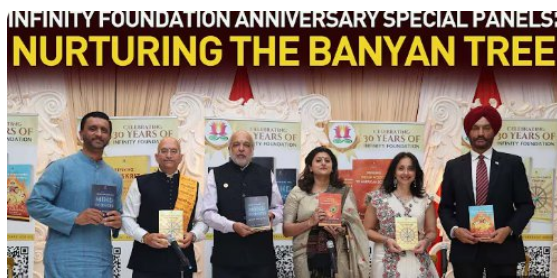
their community (jati) and nation (raashtra), rather than rights. Unlike democratic systems that emphasize individualism with equal voting rights regardless of competence, the traditional Indian model focused on collective responsibility and optimizing well-being. He argues that modern democracies often empower the loudest voices rather than the most qualified, leading to imbalance.

He warns that AI is disrupting societies by replicating human creativity algorithmically, creating a new digital caste system controlled by a few elite tech owners. India supplies a vast tech workforce but doesn't own the technologies, placing it at the lower rungs of this system. Comparing India to China, he notes that China's centralized, algorithm-based governance fuels rapid technological advancement, unlike India's fragmented democracy and education system, which fails to create sufficient jobs or nurture necessary skills.

He advocates for fostering tough values drawn from the Mahabharata's teachings to prepare resilient citizens. Further, he calls for accountability from billionaires, a proactive role for gurus and organizations like the RSS, and constitutional reforms to strengthen India's sovereignty and social fabric in the face of AI-driven global shifts. 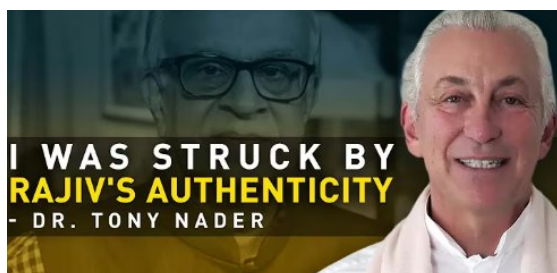
Infinity Foundation Anniversary Special Panels: Nurturing the Banyan Tree

"I was struck by Rajiv's Authenticity" - Dr. Tony Nader

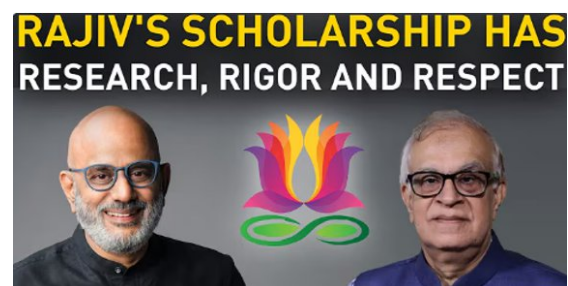

The speaker draws parallels between his own entrepreneurial journey and Rajiv Malhotra's, noting how both transitioned after successful exits to focus on giving back. Exposure to Rajiv's book *Being Different* sparked his involvement, leading to close collaboration.

GLOBAL TRIBUTES to our 30-year legacy



At the 30th anniversary of the Infinity Foundation, trustee Seema Singh opened the program by reading a congratulatory message from Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Modi praised Rajiv Malhotra's decades of work in preserving India's intellectual and cultural heritage, highlighting the Foundation's role in nurturing confident generations of thinkers, strengthening civilizational ties

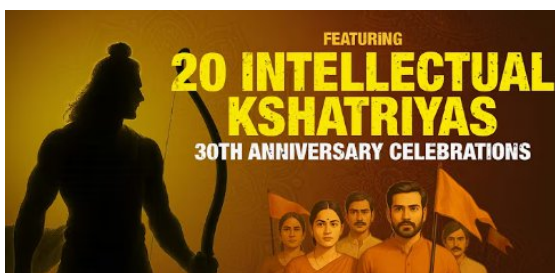
and guiding global engagement with Bharatiya knowledge.

Featuring 20 Intellectual Kshatriyas | 30th anniversary celebrations



At an evening gathering hosted by Rajiv Malhotra at his residence, numerous

intellectual kshatriyas inspired by his work introduced themselves and shared their contributions.

Tahir Gora Chawla spoke about his effort to awaken desi Muslims to their Hindu ancestry, while Dr. Omendra Ratnu discussed helping 15,000 Pakistani Hindus resettle in India amidst persistent violence and forced conversions in Pakistan. Rahul Sur highlighted his petition to the UN on the genocide of minorities in Pakistan, while Sukhi Chahal emphasized Hindu-Sikh unity against Khalistani propaganda.

Richa Sinha described her work on a Hinduphobia bill in Scotland, and Pandit Satish Sharma underscored the global battle of narrative. Mohinder Gulati spoke of blocking caste-focused agendas at the World Bank and building a Hindu temples network.

Rajiv Malhotra speaks on Pahalgam terror attacks | American Hindu Jewish Congress



Rajiv Malhotra discussed the Pahalgam terror attack at this high impact event of the American Hindu Jewish Congress, a new initiative pioneered by Arthur Kapoor, Chairman of the AHJC. Speaker Mike Johnson and several other Congressmen participated, expressing strong support for Hindus and Jews against terrorism.

Rajiv says that it would be incorrect to treat the Pahalgam episode as an India-Pakistan issue as it would limit our response. It is important instead to study the philosophy of the bad actors, their training, mindset, strategies and weapons, so we can see how they are operating on a global scale with the goal of establishing a caliphate beyond current national boundaries.

Hindus and Jews have several commonalities including the fact that we are at the forefront of this attack. We are also civilizations that have survived for a very long time despite no mandate to convert others or to interfere with their religious practices. [Video](#).
